FINDING YOUR WAY

Welcome to the Anchorage Museum. Finding your way around is easy if you keep in mind the museum is divided into two wings: a West Wing, which has four levels and an East Wing, which has two levels.

The wings are connected on levels 1 and 2.

TO HELP ORIENT YOU

If you came in the main entrance with its distinctive yellow lobby, you are in the West Wing.

As you explore the museum, you may wander through a light-filled open area (atrium) with a large marble staircase next to a water feature. This is the East Wing.

LEVEL 2

SMITHSONIAN ARCTIC STUDIES CENTER
Rare Alaska Native heritage objects from the Smithsonian National Museum of Natural History and the National Museum of the American Indian.

CONOCOPHILLIPS GALLERY
Contemporary Alaska Native art in both traditional and non-traditional styles.

MAIN LEVEL

MUSEUM SHOP
Variety of Alaska Native art, unique jewelry, learning games and books on Alaska history and culture.

MUSE RESTAURANT
Imaginative cuisine offered in a lounge-like setting, complete with outdoor patio.

BOB AND EVANGELINE ATWOOD ALASKA RESOURCE CENTER (LIBRARY AND ARCHIVES)
Access to thousands of Alaska photographs, publications and historical maps.

LEVEL 4
BRIAN E. DAVIES CHUGACH GALLERY
Changing exhibitions gallery with a view of the Chugach Mountains and Anchorage.

LEVEL 3
CHANGING EXHIBITIONS
Art, history and science related exhibits are presented in these galleries on a rotating basis.

EAST WING

LEVEL 2
ALASKA HISTORY GALLERY
The history of Alaska's people from pre-contact times to present, including artifacts from the many distinct Alaska Native cultures, Russian occupation and the gold rush era.

UPPER ATRIUM GALLERY
Art, history and science related exhibits are presented in these galleries on a rotating basis.

MAIN LEVEL
ART OF THE NORTH GALLERY
Reflecting the regional landscape, themes include exploration, lifestyles, wildlife and portraits.

LOWER ATRIUM GALLERY
Art, history and science related exhibits are presented in these galleries on a rotating basis.

IMAGINARIUM DISCOVERY CENTER
Explore earth, life and physical science through hands-on exhibits.

THOMAS PLANETARIUM
Educational, entertaining films and presentations that explore the night sky and the solar system.

AUDITORIUM
Films on history, art and culture offered daily during summer months.
