

INTRODUCTION TO PAINTING MATERIALS

SUPPLY LIST

Please have the following supplies ready for the first day of class:

\$15.00 Lab Fee

Four 1/4" thick 10 x 10" (appx., can be any size around this) masonite or MDF panels (you can buy these and have them cut at a hardware store)

Two 3" natural bristle gesso brush

Recommended: "Chalimont" size 080 sold by Kremer NY. If you decide to purchase this, please do so soon to allow ample time for shipping. You may find this particular brush at the following link:

Sandpaper (couple sheets each of Medium #100 and Fine #150)

Acrylic "gesso" primer, 32 oz. should suit

3-4" Palette knife (trowel-shaped, preferably without any sharp edges.)

Heavy duty stretcher bars to make a 20 x 30" canvas

Additional heavy duty stretcher bars (any size, but keep it small) to make another stretched canvas

Scissors

Canvas pliers

Staple gun with staples (light duty)

Canvas (cotton duck, no less than 10 oz. to fit stretcher bars. Personally, I'm a fan of 15 oz. for a heavier weave.)

These are supplies you will need for the other classes. You do not need to bring these on the first day:

One sheet of 22 x 30" (appx.) watercolor paper (heavy weight)

Small jar with a lid for egg yolk

Squeeze bottle for clean water

Small storage jars (for small amounts of pigment to work in between classes.)

Two or more jars or plastic containers for water

Watercolor brushes

Watercolor palette

Two to three eggs

Charcoal, pencil, pen (something to draw with.)

Cotton Rags

Oil brushes (bristle)

Palette (1/4" thick sheet of glass works best; you can get these at the hardware store)

Turpenoid (odorless turpentine such as "Gamsol" suits, but nothing scented.)

Metal or glass container for solvent

Small glass jars for mediums

Oil paints (Gamblin or Windsor & Newton preferred)

Acrylic brushes (bristle preferred, as long as they are not the same brushes you use to make oil paintings as mixing brushes is not good practice.)
