Gustav T. Johnson was born in Sweden on October 16, 1902. He came to Alaska in 1941 and worked for Hahn Plumbing until 1960, when he founded his own business, Johnson Plumbing. Gust was a member of the Anchorage Moose Lodge No. 1534, the Plumbers and Steam Fitters Local 367, and the Alaska Pioneers in Anchorage. He died February 7, 1991, and is buried in Talkeetna.

Scope and Content Description:

The collection consists of one album measuring 12.5 x 14.25", containing 16 color and 74 black-and-white photographs as well as ephemera documenting damage in Anchorage from the 1964 Alaska Earthquake. For more information, see Detailed Description of Collection.
