

MY TRIP TO THE ANCHORAGE MUSEUM






TAKE MY TIME

SOME OBJECTS ARE FOR TOUCHING




I CAN TOUCH DISPLAYS IF MY ADULT OR MUSEUM STAFF SAYS IT IS OK TO TOUCH.


ALASKA GALLERIES


COLAB


THOMAS PLANETARIUM

I CAN BUY FOOD





THERE ARE LOTS OF BATHROOMS










IF I NEED TO **USE THE BATHROOM**, I WILL LOOK FOR A BATHROOM SIGN OR ASK MUSEUM STAFF.
