How can I create art from nature?

Skills to Develop

- + Fine motor
- + Creative thinking

Materials

- + Leaves, sticks, pinecones, etc
- + Construction paper
- + Crayons/colored pencils/markers
- + Contact paper
- + Glue
- + Googly eyes (optional)
- + Pipe cleaners (optional)

WHAT TO DO

Prepare Before the Activity

- 1. Find a place where it is appropriate to collect natural materials. This may be your yard or a local park.
- 2. Take your child outside and collect natural items from the ground such as leaves, pine cones, or rocks. Items must be dry or left to dry.

During the Learning Activity

- 1. Collect all materials in your workspace.
- 2. Discuss with children what they see and feel when they look at art.
- **3. Leaf rubbing**: Arrange leaves and other items under paper. Rub using the side of crayon or chalk. Trace the veins lines using crayon tip.
- **4. Nature portrait:** Lay out contact paper and have children arrange items on the sticky side to make a portrait. Alternatively, children can glue items to paper and add details with coloring utensils.
- **5. Animal Invention:** Using a pine cone for body, make an imaginary animal. Sticks or pipe cleaners may be added for legs. Googly eyes are a fun addition. Children may use regular or craft glue to attach or have adult help using hot glue.

Extend the Fun

- + Paint rocks and leave them for others to find.
- + Search the Anchorage Museum's <u>Online Collection</u> for objects made from natural materials.
