**Administrative/Biographical History**

James “Mike” Dinges was born in Colorado in 1958, to James “Jim” Dinges and Sue Dinges. He enlisted in the United States Air Force right after graduating high school in the summer of 1976. After basic, he studied as a weather observer, and was stationed in Langley SFB, in Hampton Virginia, before being transferred to Galena Air Force Station in December of 1978. After his discharge, returned to Alaska as an independent contractor to work on the Long Range Radar Sites (LRRS). He was first assigned to Cape Newenham, continuing his work as a weather observer. He worked at other sites as well, including Sparrevohn, Tin City, Cape Romanzof, Indian Mountain, and Barter Island.

While working on the sites, Michael took time off and earned two undergraduate degrees in History and Sociology from the University of Washington. He graduated with honors, and then returned to the sites to continue making a living. At Barter Island, he met Patricia Boyer, whom he subsequently married in 1994 and they had two children, Samuel and Benjamin. He retired from work on the sites to pursue a law degree at University of Oregon, Eugene Campus. Returning to Alaska, Michael obtained a position working for NEA, and has been doing so from 2000 to the present, putting his experience in rural Alaska to great use working with education faculty in the villages.

#### Scope and Content Description:

The collection consists of 93 personally produced 35 mm slides, as well as 62 color prints. Additionally, an Alaska Air Command Installations and Data book containing locations, costs, and statistical information on all of the LRRS sites is included, along with a TV guide and two base newspapers from Galena in 1979. The images document Michael's time on the sites, with focus on images of the sites themselves and remnants of the White Alice installations equipment.

Arrangement: Collection is arranged by format and location.
