Administrative/Biographical History:

Judith Willets Irons was born December 15, 1947, in St. Paul, MN, to Harry and Jane (Prendergast) Sattler and was raised in Florida after the age of 6. She first became interested in the construction industry by seeing the work of her father and his brother-in-law who held construction contracts in Florida.

Judith married her first husband in 1968 and moved to California, then Alaska in 1969. Shortly after arriving in Anchorage/Dgheyaytnu, she went to work for NC Machinery Company in Anchorage/Dgheyaytnu as a Secretary in the Service Department. From 1969 to early-1974, Judith became a Management Trainee for NC Machinery Company. In 1974, Judith was promoted to Administrative Coordinator and transferred to Fairbanks to establish the new branch (located alongside the NC Machinery Co branch in Fairbanks on the Steese Highway) for the joint venture between NC Machinery Co and John Fabick Tractor Company of Illinois (NC-Fabick Co) for the Trans-Alaska Pipeline Project (TAPS).

In early 1975, Judith chose to seek employment with TAPS. She was dispatched from the International Union of Operating Engineers (IUOE) no. 302 to Pump Station 6 on the Yukon

River/Ooghekuhno' as a Mechanics Helper Clerk in the equipment shop. She was reassigned to Service Oiler and then Rig Oiler on cranes and backhoes. Moving about the project as a rig oiler allowed Judith to take pictures of the ongoing construction sequence of Pump Station 6 until the end of the project in 1977.

In November of 1977, Judith went to work as a Purchasing Agent for Arctic Slope Alaska General in Anchorage/Dgheyaytnu as buyer of equipment parts, building materials, and camp supplies for their camps and construction projects in Prudhoe Bay, Valdez/Suacit, and the Petroleum Reserve Cat trains. In April 1978, Judith was transferred to the Service City Camp at Prudhoe Bay and the Cat Trains for Husky Oil in Petroleum Reserve 4 and the Cat Train for Chevron at Killik (Ivotuk) in the Brooks Range/Gwazhał as Parts and Warehouseman. This work with Prudhoe Bay is where Judith met her current husband Johnny Richard Irons.

After the NC Machinery and TAPS projects ended, Judith went on to work on other construction projects in Anchorage/Dgheyaytnu, including: Providence Hospital Phase II and III, the Anchorage Performing Arts Center, Bradley Lake Hydroelectric Project, Hotel & Condominium renovations and new construction on Kauai, Hawaii for Pacific Construction Co of Anchorage, Alaska, and Fletcher Pacific Construction Co., Ltd. of Honolulu, HI.

Judith and Johnny Irons married in May 1995 in Spokane, WA, after they retired from the Alaska unions. They moved to Reno, NV, in 1995 for Johnny's work with the IUOE Local 3 until he retired in 1997. Since retirement, Judith published a genealogical reference on the Hoover Dam Construction Workers and Pioneer Family members of Hoover Dam and Boulder City in 2008 and is currently working on the lower half of the Boulder Canyon Project in the Yuma, AZ, and Imperial and Coachella Valleys of California. Much of her time is spent in continuing research with the hope of publishing a genealogical reference to the second half of the project by 2027. Judith currently lives with her husband Johnny in Elko County, NV.

This biography was edited from a two-page biography provided by the donor. The full, original biography is available in the collection's accession file.

Scope and Content Description: This collection consists of 914 photographic prints, approximately 4x5", that were originally housed in 11 separate photo albums. The images document the personnel and construction of Pump Station 6 of the Trans-Alaska Pipeline.

Arrangement: This collection maintains original order within each photo album. The albums are arranged chronologically and by subject.
