- .4 On the trail. On the trail going toward Pt. Hope [musher and dog team pulling loaded sled crossing snowy tundra]
- .5 Reindeer & Eskimo herder [man standing on tundra making notations in ledger, herd of reindeer in background]
- .6 Baby goes to ride [woman wearing fur parka standing outside in winter, carrying baby, building in background. At AFN 2015, tentatively identified as Elsie Adams of Kotzebue]
- .7 [man and two women wearing fur parkas standing outside house holding bird carcass, possibly tundra swan. At AFN 2015, woman identified as Ticasuk Emily Ivanoff Brown]
