- .1 – [view down boardwalk to building. Per Timothy Miller: “Sackett Hall houses up to 37 co-ed students in four-person suites with bathroom, refrigerators, and a microwave. Sackett Hall includes meal service, a spacious common area, cable T.V., wireless connection, coin-operated laundry, and is within close walking distance of the campus and the Consortium Library. Sackett Hall is next to UA Kuskokwim Campus, located at 205 Akiak Drive”]
- .2 – [two-story house on water, with snowmachines in driveway]
- .3 – [houses on Katie Hatley Lane, with street sign at right]
- .4 – [town scene, street corner, dumpster with ravens painted on it in center. Per Timothy Miller: Blueberry Subdivision]
- .5 – [exterior of Yukon-Kuskokwim Delta Regional Hospital]
- .6 – [town scene in residential area, with house numbered 335 in center, boardwalk leading to house]
- .7 – [riverboat and barge tied to riverbank]
- .8 – [river scenic, with rainbow in distance, barge in right foreground]
- .9 – [river docks area, with small boats tied up at left near parked vehicles, cranes and ships at right]
- .10 – [rainbow over Moravian Church]
- .11 – [street view, with AC Value Center at right, Video World in background]
- .12 – [exterior of AC Value Center, with taxi cab parked in front; Alaska Commercial Co.]
