2019 Spring Education Internship Opportunity

WHEN: Spring Semester: ~January 14 – May 15, 2019
Start and end dates are flexible.
Work schedule will be approximately 15 hours a week, Monday – Friday.

WHERE: Education Department at Anchorage Museum in beautiful Anchorage, Alaska.

WHAT: The Anchorage Museum is seeking an enthusiastic applicant for the spring term of the 2019 academic year. Opportunities and training may include object-based teaching, developing classes and tours for K-12 audiences, as well as educational and outreach materials, with a focus on the Art of the North galleries and the Alaska exhibition. Interns will assist with program delivery and tours, create resources, and provide overall support to education programming, including but not limited to school groups, public programs, and classes for the public. One of the internship positions will specifically assist with organization, sampling, and analyzing sound files related to a state-wide K-12 soundscape ecology project.

Internship recipients will receive a stipend of \$2,500 per semester. Housing, benefits and transportation are not provided.

WHO: Applicants must be at least 18, must be computer literate, and should be a current student or a recent graduate in Education, Museum Studies, Art, History, Native Studies or related field. Previous experience with curriculum development or teaching is preferred, but not required.
