



2019 Summer Camp Education Internship Opportunities

WHEN: May 24 to July 26, 2019, with the week of July 1-5 off.
Work schedule will be approximately 40 hours a week,
Monday-Friday.

WHERE: The Anchorage Museum at Rasmuson Center in Anchorage, AK

WHAT: The Anchorage Museum is seeking four (4) enthusiastic applicants for the 2019 summer camp season. These summer internships are funded by the Anchorage Museum Association. Opportunities and training may include developing activities for camp sessions as well as educational and outreach materials. Interns will assist with camp delivery, creating resources, and providing support and supervision throughout the camp season. Interns will spend time in the classrooms interacting with and engaging children in daily camp activities in an environment that aids in the exploration of art, culture, history, science and technology. Interns will also have the opportunity for professional development and CV workshops.

Internship recipients will receive a stipend of \$4800 for the summer. Housing, benefits and transportation are not provided.

WHO: Applicants must be at least 18 years old with a high school diploma or equivalent, must be computer literate, and should be a current student or graduate in Science, Education, Museum Studies, Art, History, Anthropology, Native Studies or related field. Previous experience with curriculum development, teaching or camp environment and First Aid and CPR certification is preferred, but not required.
