



2019 AAMD Diversity Internship Opportunity

The Anchorage Museum connects people, expands perspectives, and encourages global dialog about the North and its distinct environment. Exploring the intersection of art, history, science, design and culture the Anchorage Museum shares multiple perspectives and experiences that offer a compelling narrative about place and people.

We welcome diverse perspectives and recognize all are enriched when a diversity of voices, viewpoints, and skills are included and engaged in the work we do.

WHEN: Approximately 12 weeks, June – August 2019, start and end dates are flexible. The work schedule will be approximately 35 hours per week, Monday – Friday, during regular business hours.

WHERE: At the Anchorage Museum in downtown Anchorage, Alaska.

WHAT: The Anchorage Museum is seeking applicants for this year's AAMD Diversity Internship. This position is funded by Association of Art Museum Directors, the American Alliance of Museums and the Anchorage Museum. Opportunities and training may include developing programs and educational and outreach materials, with a focus on upcoming exhibitions. Interns will assist with program delivery, tours, the development of collateral materials, and will provide overall support to education and interpretation, including, but not limited to, working with school groups, public programs, classes and workshops.

The incumbent will receive a stipend of \$6,300. Housing, benefits and transportation are not provided. Two professional development gatherings will be required and provided, with the American Alliance of Museums and the Association of Art Museum Directors.

WHO: Applicants must be at least 18, must be computer literate, and should be a current student or a recent graduate in museum studies, art, art history, cultural studies, or related field. Previous experience with curation, curriculum or program development is preferred, but not required.
