## HOME EDITION COLAB PAPER BASKET

## PAPER BASKET

## Materials

- 17 sheets of colored printer paper
- 1 card-stock piece of paper
- Glue
- Art knife or scissors
- Jar lid ( from 8.oz jar)

Step 1: Cutting and folding paper-

In this step you need a colored origami paper and art knife for cutting.



1. Gather your 4 pieces of paper in the color of your choice.



2. Fold each piece of paper in half.



3. Cut papers into 5mm by 12mm strips



4. Take one of the cut pieces and fold in half the long way.

5. Fold in half the long way again.



6. Fold in half the sort way.






5. Fold each side of the folded paper in half forming three folds.




6. This is how the folded paper will look.




7. Repeat the previous steps and fold 26 strips.




8. Take two folded strips and slide one inside the other through the slots.




9. Take a third strip and slide it through the second strip.




10. This is how the attached strips will look.



11. Take a fourth strip and slide it through the third one.



12. Take a fifth strip and slide it through the fourth strip.



13. Keep adding new strips until you complete the 26 strips.



14. This is how the attached folded strips will look.




15. Round your paper and con-nect both ends together forming a ring shape.



16. Repeat the previous steps and make 3-4 colored rings.

Step 2: Connecting rings and creating the bottom of the basket<del>.</del>

In this step, you will need an additional origami paper of a different color and a jar lid.




1. Stack rings on top of each other.



2. Select a new color of paper and cut into 11 pieces measuring 5mm by 12mm each.



3. Fold the length of each piece in half.




4. Fold the strips again forming long strips.



5. Repeat the last two steps and fold the rest of the strips.



6. Take one strip and slide it through the slots of the stacked layers.



7. Make sure the strip goes through all layers to secure it and keep all layers together.



8. This is how the basket will look once you insert all 11 strips.



9. Using a jar lid cut a circle out of card-stock paper.



10. Place the card-stock circle at one end of the basket to create the bottom.



11. Glue the extra strips on the back of the cardboard circle to create the bottom.



12. This is how the bottom of the basket will look.
