# HOME EDITION COLAB SMYTHE BINDING

# **COLAB SMYTHE BINDING**

### **Materials**

- Paper (inner pages)
- Cardstock (end pages)
- Cardboard or book board
- Fabric or scrapbook paper (outer cover)
- Thread
- Ribbon
- Glue
- Beeswax (optional)
- Needle
- Awl
- Exacto knife
- Scissors
- Clamps

Note: Try substituting similar materials in place of any items you do not have on hand.

## Step 1: Create your text block

The first step is to make and bind the text block of inner pages.




Cut pages to the desired size.



#### 4.

Cut a piece of paper the same height as your pages and 4-5 inches wide to use as a template. Fold it in half to create a crease.



2. Fold the pages in half.



# 5.

Mark three holes evenly spaced along the crease of the template. Place the template in the fold of the first signature.




Stack pages 3-4 deep to create signatures. You must have an even number of signatures.



#### 6. Use your awl to punch holes in all the signatures.




7. Stack your signatures in order to be sure the holes align.





Gently pull the thread through the center hole, leaving a tail of 2-3 inches.




8.

Measure a length of thread equal to the distance between holes on a single signature, times the number of signatures, plus 2-3 extra lengths. Cut your thread.



Sew out through the hole on the right and gently pull the thread tight.



9. Sew into the center hole of the first signature.




12. Stack the second signature onto the first, aligning the holes.




13. Sew into the right hole on the second signature.



16. Sew out the left hole on the second signature.




14. Sew out of the center hole on the second signature.




17. Sew into the left hole on the first signature.




15. Loop around the tail and sew back through the same center hole.




18. Sew out the center hole on the first signature.



19. Carefully sew under the loop.




Sew under the stitch holding the first two signatures together.


Stack the third signature on top. Sew into the center hole of the third signature.




23. Add a fourth signature. Sew into the right hole on the fourth signature.




21. Sew out through the right hole on the third signature.



24. Sew out the center hole on the fourth signature.




25. Sew under the stitch holding the previous two signatures together.



Sew under the stitch holding the first two signatures together.




26. Sew back into the center hole of the fourth signature.



# 29.


Sew back into the left hole of the third signature. You should not have sewn here yet.



27. Sew out through the left hole on the fourth signature.



30. Sew out the center hole on the third signature.





Sew under the stitch holding the last two signatures together. Repeat this pattern until you have attached as many signatures as you desire.



Cut two pieces of end paper to the same size as your inner pages and fold in half.




32. When all signatures are attached, tie the end tails into a knot.



35. Dut

Put glue along the 1.5-2 inches of the inner pages closest to the spine.



33. Spread a generous amount of glue along the spine of the book.



36.

Gently align the endpage and place it in the glue. Repeat on the backside.



37. Cut a piece of paper about the same height as your textblock and wide enough to wrap around the spine with about 2 inches to glue onto the front and back. This will help stabilize the spine.



40. Allow your textblock to dry completely.



38.

Glue the paper in place along the spine. Smooth out any bubbles and wrinkles.



39.

Glue the front and back in place to the end paper. Smooth out any bubbles and wrinkles.

#### Step 2: Add a cover

The next step is to add a hard cover to your text block.



1. Cut two cardboard covers a 1/2 inch taller and a 1/4 inch wider than your inner pages. Cut a spine the height of your covers and the width of your textblock.



#### 4.

Cut the corners of your cover fabric at a 45 degree angle approximately a cardboard width from the corner of your cover.




2. Measure your cover fabric or paper. You will need to account for a 1/4 inch + width of cardboard gap on either edge of the spine and include a 1 inch overhang on all sides. Cut to size.



# 5.

Fold the cover fabric around the top and bottom edge of your book. Glue in place.



3. Glue your cover fabric or paper in place. Carefully smooth out any air bubbles or wrinkles.



#### 6.

Fold the cover fabric around the left and right edge of your book. Glue in place.



7. Put glue on the front end page of the textblock and the inner cover.



10.

Put weight on your book. Allow to dry completely.



8.

Align the front endpage in the center of the cover. Gently press into place and smooth out any bubbles or wrinkles.



11.

**Congratulations!** The book is now finished and you can start filling it with your drawings and thoughts!



9. **Repeat this process** to attach the back cover.
