Administrative/Biographical History:

Elva "Willie" Kanuak (Ahmasuk) Amidon was born on March 6, 1938, in Wales, Alaska. She was one of 14 children from Harold and Anna Qiliq Ahmasuk. The family lived in Nome during the flu pandemic.

As an adult, Elva served as a lieutenant in the Civil Air Patrol where she met Gene Loren Amidon, a young airman stationed in Nome. They married on April 23, 1958, and had seven children. Due to the nature of Gene's U.S. Air Force career, the couple lived all over the world on numerous assignments. After retiring from the Air Force in 1977, Gene and Elva returned to Alaska.

Elva was instrumental in the formation of Alaskans on the Potomac, which was active in the early days of the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act (ANCSA). Alaskans on the Potomac provided support services to Alaskans and Indigenous visiting Washington D.C. She also served as an executive assistant at the Shareholder Division of the CIRI Foundation, President of the Ladies' Auxiliary Service at the Alaska Native Medical Center, and as a court watch for the

Cook Inlet Native Association for Abused Women in Crisis. She was also a master seamstress and an avid hunter. Elva passed away on Jan. 12, 2022 ¹.

Scope and Content Description:

This collection consists of 267 photo negatives, some of which were taken prior to Elva's birth in 1938. The images primarily depict Indigenous people and communities in Nome and Wales, and document cultural activities, including dancing, skin processing, modes of travel, ice fishing, and use of reindeer. There are some images of Indigenous students in classroom settings. The collection also documents Amidon's time spent serving in the Civilian Air Patrol.

Arrangement: Original order maintained.

Physical Access: Original items in good to fair condition. Two items have been separated from collection and are not available for access due to condition.
