



Fall 2021 Education Internship

The Anchorage Museum is for people, place, planet, and potential, in service of a sustainable and equitable North, and with creativity and imagination for what is possible. We strive to be a place of ideas and transformation, narratives and perspectives, resilient and relevant communities, and responsive to a rapidly changing world toward a better future for all.

WHEN: 2021 Academic Year: September 2021 – May 2022, start and end dates are flexible. Summer Semester: May 2021 – August 2021, start and end dates are flexible. Work schedule will be approximately 16 hours a week, with minimum shift lengths of 4 hours, and could include working afternoons, nights, weekends, and holidays. Weekday availability preferred.

WHERE: This internship will be a combination of remote and onsite work within the Education Department at the Anchorage Museum, Anchorage, Alaska.

WHAT: The Anchorage Museum is seeking enthusiastic applicants for the 2021/2022 academic year.

The intern will be part of a team developing and refining educational resources for the Anchorage Museum. Opportunities and training include researching and developing resources, facilitating educational experiences, and refining research practices. The intern will receive training and support to lead programs independently, including but not limited to hosting field trip experiences, assisting in uploading and maintaining resources in the education resource hub and editing materials using programs from the Adobe Creative Suite.

The intern will create a program or resource during the fall semester and present it to museum visitors during a public event during the spring semester. The intern will learn to develop and further upgrade educational resources and how to maintain them. Interns will be expected to use programs from the Adobe Creative Suite including, but not limited to: InDesign, Photoshop, and Audition.

Internship recipients will receive a stipend of \$2,500 per semester. Housing, benefits, unemployment, and transportation are not provided.

WHO: Applicants must be at least 18, computer literate, have a passion for the arts and humanities, and may be a current student or a recent graduate in Science, Education, Museum Studies, Art, History, Native Studies or related field. Previous experience with informal teaching is preferred, but not required.
