OVERVIEW OF THE COLLECTION

Language and Scripts: The collection is in English.

Name of creator(s): Butler, Alice M.

Administrative/Biographical History:

Little is known about Alice M. Butler. According to the accession file, she lived in Anchorage until June of 1967, when she moved to Seattle to be near a clinic for her deafness and to be near her granddaughter, Mrs. Jack Morrison, Jr.

Scope and Content Description:

This collection consists of one clipping diary created by Alice Butler. It primarily contains clippings of poetry, but also includes some brief stories along with handwritten notes and pages. One diary entry page is dated 1942, another 1943. There is a note that Axel Olson died in 1957, indicating the diary was updated later, or possibly continued into the next decade.

CONDITIONS GOVERNING ACCESS AND USE

Restrictions on Access: The collection is open for research use.

Physical Access: Original items in good condition.

Technical Access: No special equipment is needed to access the materials.
