- .2 – [Six men watching a seventh man digging a hole, with a bulldozer in the center of the picture]
- .3 – [Suspension bridge on the Alaska Highway possibly in British Columbia]
- .4 – [Construction camp (?) along the Alaska Highway]
- .5 – [A row of four Pacific huts, with man standing by door of the hut on the left]
- .6 – [Two trucks that have gone over the shoulder of the Alaska Highway; the one on the right has spilled a load of fuel drums]
- .7 – [A scene along the early highway]
- .8 – [Eleven unidentified men: man on right, front row, is wearing a sweatshirt with the logo of the U.S. Army, Kodiak, Alaska]
- .9 – [Bridge on the highway, possibly in Canada]
- .10 – [Truck hauling steel I beams; man sits on the hood of another truck on the right]
- .11 – [Truck crossing a bridge somewhere on the highway]

- .12 – [Suspension bridge under construction along the highway]
- .13 – [Scenery]
- .14 – [Lake along the highway]
- .15 – [Lake along the highway, with construction camp on lower left]
