Administrative/Biographical History:

As a result of the 1964 Good Friday Earthquake, the land around the town of Seldovia subsided several feet, allowing high tides to wash over the main waterfront boardwalk and into buildings along the shore. The boardwalk was later replaced and the town was rebuilt on fill.

Scope and Content Description:

The collection contains two black-and-white aerial photographs of Seldovia, taken from approximately the same elevation and orientation, showing the town and coastline before and after the 1964 Alaska Earthquake.
