Administrative/Biographical History:

James J. Delaney was born in Castlerea, County Roscommon, Ireland, on August 26, 1896. He immigrated to the United States at the age of eighteen, settling in Holyoke, Massachusetts, in 1914.¹

In 1916, like many others, Delaney came to Anchorage to work for the Alaskan Engineering Commission, precursor of the Alaska Railroad. He was employed by the railroad for forty-one years in many different positions, including: clerk (1916-1929), chief clerk (1929-1933), examiner of accounts (1937-1942), assistant general manager (1943-1948), and real estate and contracting agent (1949-1957).⁴ He retired in 1957 as the Railroad's real estate and contracting agent.

In 1918, Delaney entered military service during World War I, remaining at Camp Lewis, Washington, near Tacoma, for a short period. Army enlistees at the camp seriously trained in anticipation of possible service in Europe. Delaney became a naturalized American citizen in January 1919 after his military petition for naturalization, filed at the U.S. District Court for the Western District of Washington at Tacoma, was approved.

By 1920, Delaney had returned to Anchorage and resumed his job as a clerk for the Alaskan Engineering Commission. Delaney was active within the Anchorage community. He joined the Elks Lodge in 1919 and, in 1924, before he was thirty years old, he became the exalted ruler. He was a member of Jack Henry Post No. 1 of the American Legion.

In 1929, Delaney was elected to his first term as mayor of Anchorage, receiving 425 votes to the 230 of his opponent, R.C. Loudermilch, a local mortician, auto garage owner, and city council member. Delaney was re-elected mayor twice, serving three consecutive one-year terms, between 1929 and 1932.

In 1929, Delaney married Nancy Marie Dillon, an Irish immigrant, who was born in Aghamore, County Mayo, Ireland, on March 5, 1896. She immigrated to America in 1927. They had three children, Nancy, James, Jr., and Loretta. The couple established a home at 303 K Street, where the Boney Memorial Court now stands.

Delaney died on April 20, 1970, at the age of seventy-three, at Providence Hospital in Anchorage. Nancy Delaney, died in Anchorage on December 29, 1986. The couple is buried in the Catholic Tract of Anchorage Memorial Park Cemetery.

Scope and Content Description:

This collection is comprised of ~758 photo prints (mostly black and white, some color) and 154 negatives. Collection also contains oversized materials including multi-panel panoramas and a map. Box 3 contains a variety of documents including: correspondence, reports, pamphlets, railroad timetables, documents regarding stocks, claim deeds and agreements, bulletins, newspaper clippings, multiple driver's licenses, and railroad passes. The images in this collection show the Delaney family and friends partaking in recreational activities in various areas in southcentral Alaska, Alaska Railroad construction and camp sites, holiday parades in Anchorage, mines and mining, and Indigenous people in southcentral and southeast Alaska. Separated Materials

During original processing, some items in this collection were cataloged as library holdings or interfiled with AEC and VF materials. It's possible that "missing" items are housed within other research files or could have been weeded or replaced as standard library practice.

In March 2026, it was found that some materials in this collection were assigned duplicative accession numbers. For resolution, non-photographic materials with duplicative identifiers were renumbered with just the collection number (B1970.019) while photographic materials maintain the full trinomial identifiers. In March 2026, Nitrate negatives were found in the collection and prepared for the freezer. See accession file for list. Nitrates have been scanned at high resolution.
