

FAQ MUSICAL PERFORMANCES FOR ELEVATOR MUSIC

What is Elevator Music?

Elevator Music is a performance opportunity held during the Anchorage Museum's free admission hours on the first Friday of each month. Single and double acts entertain museum guests with acoustic numbers inside of our massive 12 x 12-foot elevator.

When is Elevator Music?

Elevator Music is held on the first Friday of most months from 6:30 to 8:30 PM.

What kind of musical groups does the museum consider for Elevator Music?

Because of the unique performance space, musical acts are limited to:

- Up-beat, family-friendly acts with **one to two performers**.
- Acoustic acts that do not require amplification for their instruments (vocal amplification is allowed).
- Acts that can fit in a 12 x 12-foot space with enough room for museum guests to still use the elevator.
- Acts that do not include extremely loud instruments such as large brass instruments, full drum sets, etc.

For how long would I be performing?

You would be performing from 6:30 to 8:30 PM with a 15-minute break.

When do I set up?

Musicians should arrive by 6:15 PM for set up and sound check.

When is sound check?

Musicians should arrive by 6:15 PM for set up and sound check.

What equipment is provided?

We provide seating and a music stand (if needed).

Can I bring my own equipment?

You are welcome to bring your own equipment, however, we ask that you not amplify any instruments during your performance. For the vocal health of singers, you may amplify your voice. Also, please keep in mind that you will not have access to a power outlet in the elevator, so please bring your own battery packs (if needed).

Will I be able to plug in any equipment?

No, there is no access to power in the elevator, so please bring your own battery packs.

Where will I be performing?

You will be performing in the large elevator near the main entrance of the museum.



How large is the elevator?

The elevator is approximately 12 by 12 feet.

Can I use the television in the elevator?

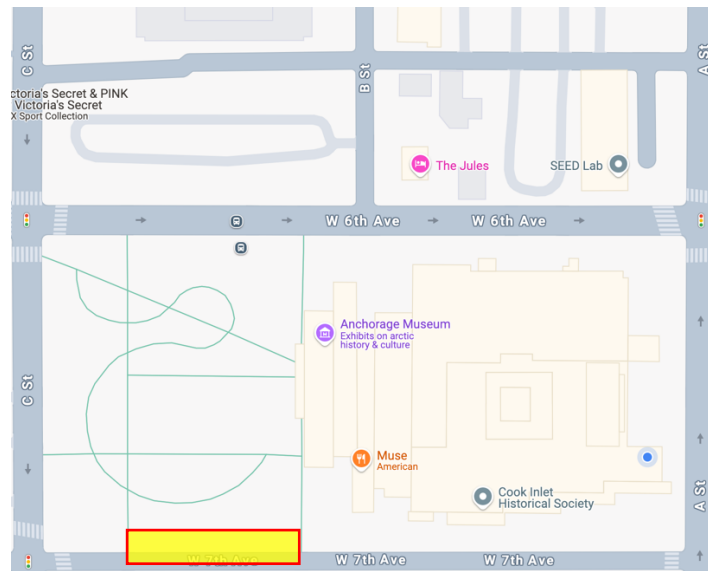
No, the television is turned off during Elevator Music.

Where can I park?

Parking in the museum's garage is available on a first come, first served basis. Street parking is also available in and around the museum. Free parking is also available for musicians one block away at Seed Lab (111 W 6th Ave).

Where can I unload my equipment?

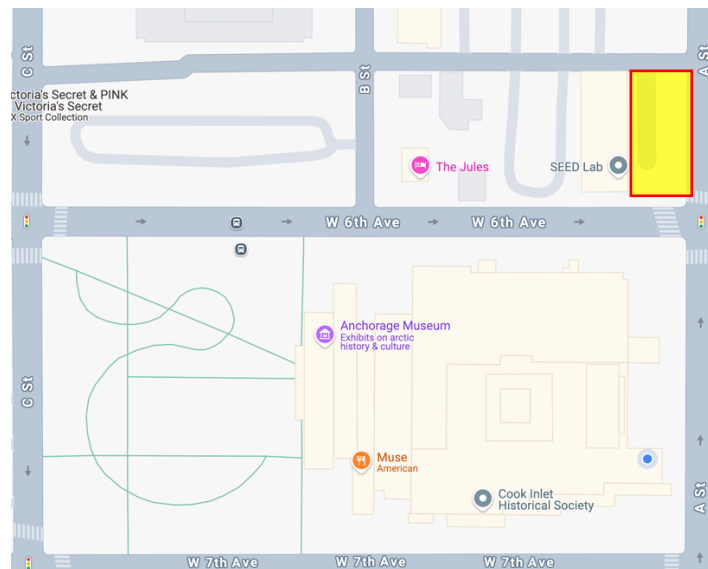
There is a loading area adjacent to the main entrance of the museum.



A loading area is available in the highlighted location.

Is free parking available?

Free parking is also available for musicians one block away at Seed Lab (111 W 6th Ave). All other parking spaces including those in the museum's garage are pay-to-park.



If parking at Seed Lab, please park in the highlighted area.

Can you reserve a parking spot for me?

No, unfortunately all parking is available on a first come, first served basis.

Where can I store my personal belongings?

Personal belongings such as small bags or purses, jackets, etc. can be stored in the museum's lockers.

How much do musicians get paid?

Compensation for Elevator Music is \$200 per performance.

How will I get paid?

The museum will mail you a check.

How long does it take to get paid?

It typically takes 1-2 weeks to receive your check in the mail.

Can I accept tips?

Musicians are not allowed to accept tips.

Can I sell my merchandise?

You may sell merchandise at Elevator Music.

How do I apply to perform for Elevator Music?

Please, complete the Google Form application found on our website.

I have been chosen to perform. Now what?

If we think you or your group would be a great fit for Elevator Music, we will reach out to you to schedule a performance date. After selecting a date, a member of museum staff will email you a contract to keep for your records. You will also receive a blank W9 PDF via email to complete and return to music@anchagemuseum.org.
