OVERVIEW OF THE COLLECTION

Dates: 1928-1938

Language and Scripts: The collection is in English.

Name of creator(s): Fred Brickley, Vern Brickley, Ellis, Gordon Springbett

Administrative/Biographical History:

Vern Brickley (1909-1970) came to Valdez, Alaska from Tacoma, Washington, in 1936 not as a photographer, but to work on a movie set. He lived through one winter on Fox Island in Prince William Sound, where he was involved in the herring fishery and raising foxes. Just prior to WWII he moved to Fairbanks, then was drafted into the Army as a photographer, and moved to Anchorage in 1940. He was in the Army at Fort Richardson for about three years and discharged in 1945. He traveled throughout the Aleutians during the Japanese invasion, and many of the photographs of Attu from the campaign bear his name. It is thought that he traded for some of these images, since he was printing them commercially.

Until 1954 Brickley and family lived in Anchorage at 920 B East 15th Avenue. He is listed continuously in the phone book until April, but no business is listed in the yellow pages. At that time the family moved to Moose Pass, and Brickley worked at the military rehab center in Seward, teaching dark room techniques. According to his son Bill, this is when he picked up the historical negatives of Seward. They moved back to Anchorage in 1958, and Brickley then became a photographer for the Army Corps of Engineers, working for the District Engineers at Elmendorf Air Force Base. Many of the Corp photographs of the 1964 earthquake are his work.

He died October 28, 1970, survived at the time by his widow, Margaret; a son, William; two daughters, Mrs. Don Parker, and Miss Eileen Brickley.

Scope and Content Description: Collection consists of one leatherbound photo album with a hand-painted cover depicting a bulldog and U.S.S. Marines insignia. Album contains: three pages (front and back) of friends' signatures and comments dating from July 1930 – August 1934; and black and white photographic prints and commercially produced photographic postcards documenting Brickley's time served in the Marines. The collection also includes newspaper clippings and three documents.

Some images depict Brickley's family, primarily his siblings and parents in Tacoma, Washington. Most of the album documents Brickley's fellow Marines aboard the U.S.S. Relief (a hospital ship) and battleship U.S.S. Maryland at various ports including those in California, as well as locations throughout the Panama Canal and Caribbean, including Trinidad, Panama, Nicaragua, and Cuba.

Arrangement: Original album order maintained. Loose materials organized by format.

.5 – A Big Pile of “Bricks” [Brickley siblings posed on residential walkway, L-R: Fred, Mable, Delcie, Vern (in U.S. Marine blue dress uniform), Ruth, Gayle, Hazel, and James. Likely Tacoma, WA]

.22 – Taken June, 1930 – Irish and Brick. The Brick is sort of Busted [W.F. Daugherty on left and Vern Brickley with a bandaged jaw on right, both in uniform on deck of possibly the U.S.S. Relief, a hospital ship]

.80 – Ready for Inspection [Marines in blue dress uniform in formation on ship deck, presumably aboard the U.S.S. Maryland]

.83 – Mary’s 16 inch Turrets No. I & II [Brickley posed between the U.S.S. Maryland’s twin 16” guns]

.121 – Mr. & Mrs. Hoover, Aboard, Maryland, Nov. 1928 [President-elect Herbert Hoover and wife, Lou Henry Hoover, on deck of the battleship U.S.S. Maryland during the 1928 Good Will Tour]

.204 – [from back:] I guess you know this bunch April – 30 [six people posed in front of Brickley Radio Service storefront, April 1930, Tacoma, WA. Fred Brickley at far right.]
