Using this Guide

Throughout the North, dogs and dog teams were a fundamental aspect of travel, hunting, and life for Indigenous peoples and explorers and settlers alike. Traditionally, dog teams were used by Indigenous peoples in the Circumpolar North throughout the winter months. Some of the most successful Arctic and Antarctic explorers learned from Indigenous teachers and imitated this practice of using dog teams, such as Knud Rasmussen's use of dogs to traverse the Inuit world from Greenland to Alaska in the Fifth Thule Expedition [Across Arctic America: Narrative of the Fifth Thule Expedition, Knud Rasmussen]. Early settlers in Alaska relied on a mix of different sledding animals native to Alaska, including dogs, or imported from elsewhere. Along with railways, dog teams were essential for the delivery of mail in Territorial Alaska until the introduction of reliable air travel in the 1930s [On Time Delivery: The Dog Team Mail Carriers, William Schneider]. Alaska has had a long history of dog team racing, beginning with the All-Alaska Sweepstakes in Nome beginning from 1908-1917, and the Fur Rendezvous and Iditarod Races in more modern times. The current day Iditarod Race was inspired by the 1925 Nome Serum run, in which relay teams of men and dogs carried serum to combat a diphtheria outbreak among the Indigenous people in Nome. Mail carriers, racers, and Alaska Native people alike participated in this relay, including All-America Sweepstakes winner Leonhard Seppala and his dogs Togo and Balto [The Cruelest Miles: The Heroic Story of Dogs and Men in a Race Against an Epidemic]. While use of dog teams in the modern day is generally restricted to recreational racing, and they were replaced by the 'Iron Dog,' (Snow-machines) in Alaskan villages in the 1960s and 1970s, they nonetheless represent a vitally important part of Alaskan history, Native and non-Native alike.

The images listed below illustrate the use of sled dogs in Alaska. The collections are ordered by accession number. In addition, a list of books pertaining to dog teams from the Atwood Resource Center library has been included at the end of this guide. Fred Henton Collection, B1965.018

The Fred Henton Collection consists of photographic prints and negative copies. The prints are primarily black and white, with some sepia and hand-tinted color prints. The collection includes snapshots, postcards, and some commercial photographs, most notably by the Lomen Bros. of Nome, Alaska. The collection depicts scenes of life in various rural and urban locales in Alaska. Henton documents scenery, people, wildlife, native culture, transportation, exploration, and architecture throughout his travels. Notable events in the collection include images of Henton with his world record Kodiak bear; various sled dog races and parades in Nome, such as the Solomon Derby and All Alaska Sweepstakes; the wreckage after a major storm in Nome, 1913; and President Harding's visit to Seward in 1923.

O.G. Herning Collection, B1967.001

In 1897 Herning was recruited by the E.C. Davis Company (Boston Brokers) to lead a group of men to the Alaska Territory to prospect gold. The following he began managing an exploration company in Tyonek Alaska. Herning eventually settled in Wasilla where he managed the Klondike and Boston Gold Mining & Manufacturing Co. While living in Wasilla has also established the Knik Trading Post. Henning's diaries

span the almost 50 years he spent living and working in these areas. Beginning in 1898, Mr. Herning drew, published and sold three different maps of the Upper Cook Inlet mining area showing trails,



geographical features and mineral areas. He was also an excellent photographer and from time to time wrote articles for various newspapers and trade magazines.
