Administrative/Biographical History:

Orville George (O.G.) Herning was born on July 30, 1868, in Eyota, Minnesota. As a young man Herning made his living as a rural schoolteacher, until 1888 when he decided to go into the produce business with D.W.A. Roby. They eventually moved the business to Naugatuck, Connecticut, where Roby had relatives. Herning married Martha Amelia "Mattie" Rogers of Naugatuck on October 10, 1894.¹ The couple had two sons, Elmer (10/18/1895-08/14/1906) and George Stanley (12/06/1904-1987).

In the spring of 1898, Herning was hired by the E.C. Davis Company to manage a team of men for the Klondike & Boston Gold Mining Company. He led Expedition No. 4—one of two expedition teams headed to the Alaska territory to prospect gold, leaving Boston on March 23, 1898² and arriving in Seattle five days later en route to Willow Creek via Qaggeyshlat (Tyonek), Dena'ina Etnena. On June 11, 1898, Herning and his team joined the Grubstake Gulch miners, establishing the Willow Creek mining district in the Talkeetna Mountains, Dena'ina Etnena and

Ahtna Territory. Herning eventually settled in Niteh (Knik) and then Wasilla, Dena'ina Etnena, where he managed the Klondike and Boston Gold Mining & Manufacturing Co. In 1905, while living in Niteh (Knik), Herning opened the Knik Trading Company (first called the Knik Cash Store).³ Herning then moved to Wasilla in 1917, building a general store there, which he operated until his death in 1947. Upon his death, his store and home were sold to Walter and Vivian Teeland. Today, the building is owned by the Wasilla-Knik Historical Society and is on the National Register of Historic Places.⁴ Henning's diaries span the almost 50 years he spent living and working in these areas.⁵

Beginning in 1898, Mr. Herning drew, published, and sold three different maps of the Upper Cook Inlet mining area showing trails, geographical features, and mineral areas. He was also a photographer and from time to time wrote articles for various newspapers and trade magazines. [From: Louise Potter, Pre-Diary Notes.] Herning's son, G. Stanley, drew a map of Knik as he remembered it in 1912.⁶

Scope and Content Description: The collection consists of 191 photographic prints and postcards, including images of Southeast Alaska, Willow Creek mining district, and Niteh (Knik / Old Knik Townsite). For more information, see Detailed Description of Collection.

Arrangement: Order maintained in line with previous numbering on backs of prints.

ADMINISTRATIVE INFORMATION

Acquisition and Appraisal Information:

Donated by Louise Potter January 15, 1967, to the Cook Inlet Historical Society. Transferred to the Anchorage Museum.

Processing Note: The collection has previously been processed, with items numbered on backs of prints.

Previously, items B1967.001.019, .026, .048, .051, and .128 were identified as missing. Per accession file records, these items—with the exception of .051—were duplicate prints, which, rather than going missing, were renumbered when the collection was originally processed, as follows:

B1967.001.019 became B1967.001.001b

B1967.001.026 became B1967.001.017b

B1967.001.048 became B1967.001.012b

B1967.001.128 was a copy of B1967.001.159, however, no copy is present in the collection at this time.

At present, two items remain missing from the collection, B1967.001.051 and .128.

At time of finding aid update, 2026: 191 photographic prints counted. 197 images listed in old version of finding aid. 191 images recorded in card catalog. 194 images listed in accession file paperwork. 194 images, 5 missing images previously listed in master accession list entry for collection.

Its numbering order does not correspond to that of the other handwritten list nor the previous nor current order of the collection. Only certain photographs have been identified as corresponding to this list; the bulk of the information included in this list remains unincorporated into the finding aid at this time.

- .2 – Valdez / 04 [back of print: Valdez] [Suacit (Valdez) waterfront at low tide, Alutiiq/Sugpiaq territory. Pier on right, snowy mountains in background. 1904]
- .3 – Seward. / 04. [Qutalleq (Seward) waterfront, Alutiiq/Sugpiaq territory, snowy mountains in background. 1904]
- .4 – [back: Kodiak, Alaska Channel; Barometer Mountain (info by Helen Simeonoff)] [Sun'aq (Kodiak) waterfront from ship, Alutiiq/Sugpiaq territory, mountains in background. Similar to B1967.001.018]

.56 – 128. Salmon [view from ship down at three individuals on dock among barrels. Load being hoisted above, crowd at railing of ship. Shore across water. Similar to B1967.001.034]

.57 – The Old Perry. At Kayak / 04. [waterfront community, individuals in rowboat, ships in background. Possibly Qe'yilteh (Kayak Island), Eyak territory. 1904]

.58 – 130. 1903 Valdez [waterfront community, crowd on wharf with dogs regarding ship. Suacit (Valdez), Alutiiq/Sugpiaq territory]

.59 – At Latouche Mine / 04. [text is backwards on image. Snowy waterfront community, individuals on wharf. Latouche Island, Alutiiq/Sugpiaq territory. 1904]

.60 – [back: Big Dan, Old Tom and the boys. Aug. 22, 1901; B67.1.60] [seven individuals posing in front of wooden building]

.61 – 5 “Winter.” K. B. Camp. 01 & 02. [back: Klondike & Boston Co.] [individual, buildings among trees. Light snow on ground. Similar to B1967.001.063. 1901 and 1902]

.64 – 23 [sluicing. Ahtna Territory, Copper River Valley] [possibly Ahtna Territory or Willow Creek Mining District, Dena’ina Ełnena]

.65 – Slucing [sic] on Grubstake. 1900. [Ahtna Territory, Copper River Valley] [hydraulic mining, mountains, two individuals working sluice box. Possibly Ahtna Territory or Grubstake Gulch Gold Mine, Willow Creek Mining District, Dena’ina Ełnena]

.66 – 57; Second Lake Knik to Mines. O G H.; Second Lake.; Birch. [rear view of horse-drawn sled crossing frozen lake midwinter. Possibly Dena’ina or Ahtna Territory] [possibly Ahtna Territory or possibly Niteh (Knik) or Willow Creek Mining District, Dena’ina Ełnena]

.67 – 118; Sushetna [sic] Landing. Hy’d Pipe; 5000 lbs [back: Klondike & Boston Co] [first “S” in Sushetna is backwards. Individual, horses pulling sled stacked with hydraulic pipes in snowy forest. Additional pipes piled to either side. Possibly Susitna Landing, Dena’ina Ełnena]

.68 – 79; Left Fork Grubstakk [sic]. [scenic valley. Ahtna Territory, Copper River Valley] [river, possibly Ahtna Territory or Grubstake Creek, Willow Creek Mining District, Dena'ina Etnena]

.69 – Craggy Cr. [distant mountain view of Craggy Creek. Ahtna Territory, Copper River Valley] [possibly Ahtna Territory or Craigie Creek, Willow Creek Mining District, Dena'ina Etnena]

.70 – Rock Cr. Near Boulder. [back: Willow Creek left Homestead Cr (center)] [Ahtna Territory, Copper River Valley] [river, valley landscape. Possibly Ahtna Territory or Willow Creek Mining District, Dena'ina Etnena]

.71 – 48 [miners sluicing. Ahtna Territory, Copper River Valley] [hydraulic mining, possibly Ahtna Territory or Willow Creek Mining District, Dena'ina Etnena]

.72 – Slucing [sic] on Grubstake. 1900. [Ahtna Territory, Copper River Valley] [hydraulic mining, individual working between two sluice boxes. Possibly Ahtna Territory or Grubstake Creek, Grubstake Gulch Gold Mine, Willow Creek Mining District, Dena'ina Etnena]

.73 – 50; Homestake. [back: Aug 9, 1900] [valley view. Ahtna Territory, Copper River Valley] [individual in sluice box. Possibly Ahtna Territory or Homestake Creek, Willow Creek Mining District, Dena'ina Etnena]

.74 – 119. Making Trail. Big Lake / 03. [rear view of horse-drawn sled crossing frozen lake midwinter] [possibly Willow Creek Mining District, Dena'ina Etnena. 1903]

.75 – 36; At the Mines. 1901. [two miners on horseback in front of building. Ahtna Territory, Copper River Valley] [possibly Ahtna Territory or Willow Creek Mining District, Dena'ina Etnena]

.76 – 124.; Ridge Camp. Near K.B. Mines. [back: Klondike & Boston Co.] [log building construction. Klondike and Boston Gold Mining & Manufacturing Co.] [forest, individual with two horses, stacks of hydraulic pipes or logs]

.77 – 62; On Little Sushetna [sic]. '02. [back: #62 Crossing the Little Sushetna [sic] River on way to Willow Cr. (L. Potter list); Klondike & Boston Co; Knik] [two individuals with horsedrawn sled hauling supplies on frozen Little Susitna (?) River. Klondike and Boston Gold Mining & Manufacturing Co.] [possibly Dena'ina Etnena. 1902]

.78 – [hydraulic mining; building and structures in background. Ahtna Territory, Copper River Valley] [possibly Ahtna Territory or Willow Creek Mining District, Dena'ina Etnena]

.79 – Hyd Hose Mining 1904. [hydraulic hose mining. Ahtna Territory, Copper River Valley] [possibly Ahtna Territory or Willow Creek Mining District, Dena'ina Etnena]

.80 – 64; K. B. Trail; Paradise Alley. [back: #64 – Passing through Paradise Valley, on trail to the Mines (L. Potter list); Klondike & Boston Co] [4 in inscription is backwards. View over two horses' heads of trail through snowy forest]

.81 – 87; Grubstake Gulch. 02. [1902. Scenic view. Ahtna Territory, Copper River Valley] [mountain valley, wooden structures in foreground. Tent at edge on right. Possibly Ahtna Territory or Grubstake Gulch Gold Mine, Willow Creek Mining District, Dena'ina Etnena]
