Administrative/Biographical History:

Little was known about the creator of these albums when this Finding Aid was written. It is known that Bertha (Bertie) Haynes (later Bertha Haynes Hanson) assembled this collection of photo albums while living in Alaska. In 1933, Bertha married Theodore (Ted) Hanson. In 1937, their daughter Victorina was born.

During the family's time in Alaska, Ted may have worked for the Forest Service or the Civilian Conservation Corp. He spent eight years at Kenai Lake Station where he filled a variety of positions, but most often that of Fire Warden.

Scope and Content Description:

The collection is comprised of three family photograph albums and is mostly organized chronologically. The albums contain primarily black and white photo prints, as well as postcards, ephemera, typed narrative pages, news and magazine clippings, and hand-tinted photographs. Depicted are the Hanson family and friends, wildlife, landscapes, travels, and the communities where Ted worked in Southcentral and Southeast Alaska. The typed narrative pages cover a range of topics, including life events, information about Alaskan animals, and

descriptions of landscapes and places. Notably, there is mention of Filipino cannery workers in Tyee (opposite .336), the invention of "Ice Worms" (opposite .338), a day spent in the Vancouver Chinatown (opposite .385-.386), and stories about Indigenous Alaskan early encounters with settlers (opposite .426).

Arrangement: Original order maintained.
