**Administrative/Biographical History:**

In 1957, Donald Stehle (b. 1923) and wife Gay Stehle (b. 1935) were transferred to Elmendorf Air Force Base in Anchorage, Alaska. At Elmendorf, Don maintained and repaired military aircraft while serving on the front lines of the Cold War with the Soviet Union<sup>1</sup>. He achieved the rank of Tech Sergeant. In 1957, their son Donald Jeffrey "Jeff" Stehle was born. In 1961, the Stehle family left Alaska when Don was transferred to a base in Michigan. He retired from the military in 1964 and died in 1980. Gay passed in 1993.

As an adult, Jeff worked as a letter carrier for 34 years in Michigan before retiring in 2015.

**Scope and Content Description:**

Collection contains 12 original photos, 11 copy prints (3 are duplicate prints), hospital materials from Jeff's birth (baby bracelet, hospital room cards, hospital receipts), 2 letters, 3 booklets, 1 pamphlet, 2 newspaper clippings, and 1 map of where the Stehle family lived on

base. The photos primarily depict the Stehle family on base, scenic photos from camping trips, and images of their journey along the ALCAN highway to and/or from Alaska.

- .1 - Old Nellie Bell. Note the frost on her, it was eighteen below zero, when this was taken Christmas morning. That is our 1956 Dodge Station Wagon. My family drove this from Michigan to Alaska up the ALCAN HWY in 1956. The rear of our Base housing. Elmendorf AFB, Anchorage, AK. C. 1957-1958. [car in front of housing on base. Has duplicate copy print.]
- .2 - So, I've got a big belly. (Donald Jeffrey) Jeff Stehle c. 1959 Elmendorf AFB Anchorage, AK [baby in bassinet]
- .3 - Bring on the chow (Donald Jeffrey) Jeff Stehle c. 1960 Elmendorf AFB Anchorage, AK [baby in highchair]
- .4 - What's the use (Donald Jeffrey) Jeff Stehle Elmendorf AFB Anchorage, AK. C. 1960 [baby laying on couch]
- .5 - Would you repeat that. (Donald Jeffrey) Jeff & Penny Stehle Elmendorf AFB Anchorage, AK. C. 1959 [dog Penny beside baby Jeff]
- .6 - Hi Grandma (Donald Jeffrey) Jeff Stehle Elmendorf AFB Anchorage, AK. C. 1960 [baby seated on couch with toys]
- .7 - Drunken Bum. Donald Stehle Elmendorf AFB C. 1960 [Donald reclined on sofa]
- .8 - View out the bedroom & kitchen windows. Elmendorf AFB C. 1960 [buildings on base, winter]
- .9 - This is where we live up stairs to the right. Base housing Elmendorf AFB C. 1957-1960. Photo taken by Don or Gay Stehle. [building exterior, winter. Has duplicate copy print.]
- .10 - Had my head out the bedroom window to take this. Elmendorf AFB Anchorage, AK. C. 1957-1960. Chugach Mtns. As seen from our base housing. This was taken by Don or Gay Stehle, probably Don. [buildings on base, winter, mountains at far distance. Has duplicate copy print.]
- .11 - This is the big game hunters the day we took our moose hunting trip. What do you think of the gear we took. A "1" Elmendorf AFB [people tying hunting gear to the roof of an automobile]
- .12 - Donald Stehle stationed at Elmendorf AFB 1956-1961 [studio portrait of Don in uniform]
- .13 - Base housing Elmendorf AFB. Anchorage, AK. Photo taken late 1950s by Don or Gay Stehle. [buildings on base, parked automobiles at left. Copy print.]
- .14 - Kenai Lake. Taken during camping trip to Kenai Peninsula c. 1957-1958 by Don or Gay Stehle while stationed at Elmendorf AFB [copy print]
- .15 - Scenery along the ALCAN HWY. 1956 or 1961. Probably Northern British Columbia. Photo taken by either Don or Gay Stehle. [view of river bridge and mountain. Copy print.]
- .16 - East Bound Alaska HWY. Toad River & Mt. Peterson (in back) East of Muncho Lake, B.C. Photo taken by Don or Gay Stehle. [river and mountain view from road. Copy print.]
- .17 - View from ALCAN HWY. Probably taken in lower British Columbia. By Don or Gay Stehle in 1956 or 1961. [landscape. Copy print.]

- .18 - Kenai Lake Alaska c. 1957 or 1958. Taken during a camping trip to the Kenai Peninsula while my family was stationed at Elmendorf AFB. Anchorage, AK. Photo taken by Don or Gay Stehle. [lake shoreline and mountain. Copy print.]
