Administrative/Biographical History:

Jeff Schultz is from the Bay Area in California. His interest in photography began in seventh grade when a friend brought an Asahi Pentax 35mm camera to school. He moved to Alaska in 1978 at the age of 18 and has built a life and career in the state for nearly 50 years. Schultz has built a career photographing both editorial and corporate assignments as well as stock photography. His award-winning images have been published worldwide in books, magazines, advertisements, brochures, annual reports, websites, retail products and more. He founded Alaska's largest stock photo agency, Alaska Stock Images, in 1990 and operated it successfully until October 2012 when he sold it.

Schultz has been the official photographer of the Iditarod Trail Sled Dog Race, commonly known as the Iditarod, since 1982.¹ The modern Iditarod is an annual sled dog race that is held in early March. The historic Iditarod Trail is between Seward and Sitkasuaq (Nome) but the modern race established in 1973 is run on a modified route between Willow and Sitkasuaq with the ceremonial start in downtown Anchorage.²
