Administrative/Biographical History:

Noel Wien started his first air charter services in 1924 in Nome / Sitnasuaq, Alaska. Northern Air Transport was incorporated by Wien in 1929, and in 1936 the airline name was changed to Wien Alaska Airlines. During this period, the airline's main area of activity was north of Fairbanks. Additional routes were added around 1960, when former Alaska Airlines and Pacific Northern Airlines feeder routes were handed over to Wien and Northern Consolidated

Airlines. In 1966 the airline was renamed Wien Air Alaska and renamed again in April 1968 when Wien merged with Northern Consolidated to form Wien Consolidated Airlines. In 1973, the airline's name was changed back to Wien Air Alaska. It ceased operations in mid-1984.

Scope and Content Description:

The collection consists of ~2800 photographic prints and contact sheets, color transparencies (120 Medium Format), negatives, and 1473 35 mm slides. Collection also contains miscellaneous documents and publications, including pamphlets, press releases, magazine articles, and newspaper clippings.

Arrangement: The collection is arranged in two series:

B1985.027 Series 1: Prints, transparencies, and negatives

B1985.027A Series 2: 35mm slides.

Series are further organized by subject.

ADMINISTRATIVE INFORMATION

Acquisition and Appraisal Information

Collection was donated by Wien Air Alaska in July 1985.

Processing Note

Collection arranged and organized by volunteer Stephanie Neal between October 1992 - June 1993. Series 2: 35mm slides were designated B1985.027A prior to 2025.

At original processing, photos in F160 were identified as surname Sevick, rather than Seveck. In November 2025, the physical materials in F160 were updated with the correct spelling (Seveck), though the alternative spelling might still be within metadata.

In November 2025, seven folders and 1 box of slides were found to be unprocessed; these items were numbered, rehoused, and added to the end of their corresponding series. Duplicative materials were discarded.

This collection contains outdated language and sentiments, and potentially harmful imagery that does not reflect the mission and goals of the Anchorage Museum. We consent to input and recommendations from communities as we work on decolonizing our collections. Due to sensitive content, the following items have been restricted:

Separated Materials

The Fokker monoplane left Fairbanks June 5, 1925 and made the flight in 7 hours and 40 minutes. Cost of that first charter was \$1,500.00.
