Administrative/Biographical History:

Vida Nye arrived in Anchorage in 1942 with her husband, Thurston Nye. The couple had been living in Toledo, Oregon, where Thurston worked at the sawmill. The two spent three months establishing residency in Alaska before being allowed to work; Thurston spent the three months working for alcohol supplier Milt Odom. Vida soon found work at Ft. Richardson in hangar D-47, where material for the war in the Aleutians was received and shipped out. Vida and Thurston stayed in Anchorage until 1946, when they drove out the Alaska Highway. The couple returned in 1955 and died in Anchorage, Vida in January 1978 and Thurston in August 1979.

Scope and Content Description:

Collection comprised of one scrapbook album with wooden cover. Primarily contains postcards and commercially produced photos that have been annotated by Vida, interspersed with ephemera and some original black-and-white photos. At the back of the album are two pages of pressed leaves and flowers that have been taped down. At the end of the collection are loose newspaper clippings, a Holiday photo card, and grocery receipt.

Arrangement: Original order maintained.
