Administrative/Biographical History:

Olive Eloise Clark was born in 1875. As a teen she was sent to Nebraska to be with her family and later pursued her education at Stanford University. Clark lived and worked in Colton, California as a high school science and chemistry teacher. In 1918, she was appointed the position of vie principal, which made her among one of the first women school administrators in the state. She retired in the early in 1940s and passed in 1959.

In 1938, Clark took a trip up the Yukon River into the Arctic Circle, and collected postcards, photographs, and ephemera that she compiled in a scrapbook with original poetry and notes about her experiences during her travel.

Scope and Content Description:

This collection consists of one scrapbook album with 87 items.
