Language and Scripts: The collection is in English.

Name of creator(s): Helen E. Jones, Schallerer's, Walter H. Knapp Jr., Jack Hunt, Arn Glantz

Administrative/Biographical History:

Helen Edith Jones served with the Red Cross during World War II and was Assistant Field Director. From the albums in this collection, it appears Jones was stationed at Fort Richardson in Anchorage, Fort Glenn on Umnak Island, and Amchitka Army Airfield on Amchitka Island. A letter from Jones (dated August 26, 1988), states

By the time the Red Cross ladies were allowed out along "the chain", the islands had been secured and it was monotonous duty for the military. Those of us assigned to the Office of the Field Directors worked days arranging emergency home leaves, and volunteered evenings in the service clubs.

Little else was known about Helen when this Finding Aid was written.

Scope and Content Description:

Collection comprised of three photograph albums and one folder of documents and ephemera.

Album 1 contains 192 photographs (primarily black and white, some color) taken between 1943-1944. The images show Eklutna, Seward, Anchorage, Fort Richardson (a dance at the

Officer's Club, the Nurses Quarters, camouflage buildings, and building interiors), Anchorage street scenes, and people, including Red Cross and U.S. Army personnel.

Album 2 contains 435 photographs (color, and black and white) taken during mid-1944 at Umnak. The images show war humor, a sheep ranch, tree planting, Unalaska, Olivia de Havilland, scenery, and people, including Red Cross personnel.

Album 3 contains 272 photographs taken between 1944-1945 at Amchitka. The images show Red Cross quarters, interiors of the Service Club, Radio WXLK, military cemeteries, airplanes, and people, including Red Cross personnel.

Box 3 also contains a folder of documents and ephemeral materials that include: identification certificates, motor vehicle operator's permits, a commendation letter, a travel control application, an envelope, a typed poem, and two documents written by Helen Jones.

Arrangement: Original order maintained.
